Kim is a huge fan of the slightly off-centre part, it frames her face better. Her look is flat at the roots with more movement at mid-length and the ends. Apply a gloss spray for extra shine.

Blow-wave large sections of your hair making sure to concentrate on the roots for lift. Place Velcro rollers in and allow to cool. Remove and brush with a soft-bristle brush. Tong the ends for more definition.



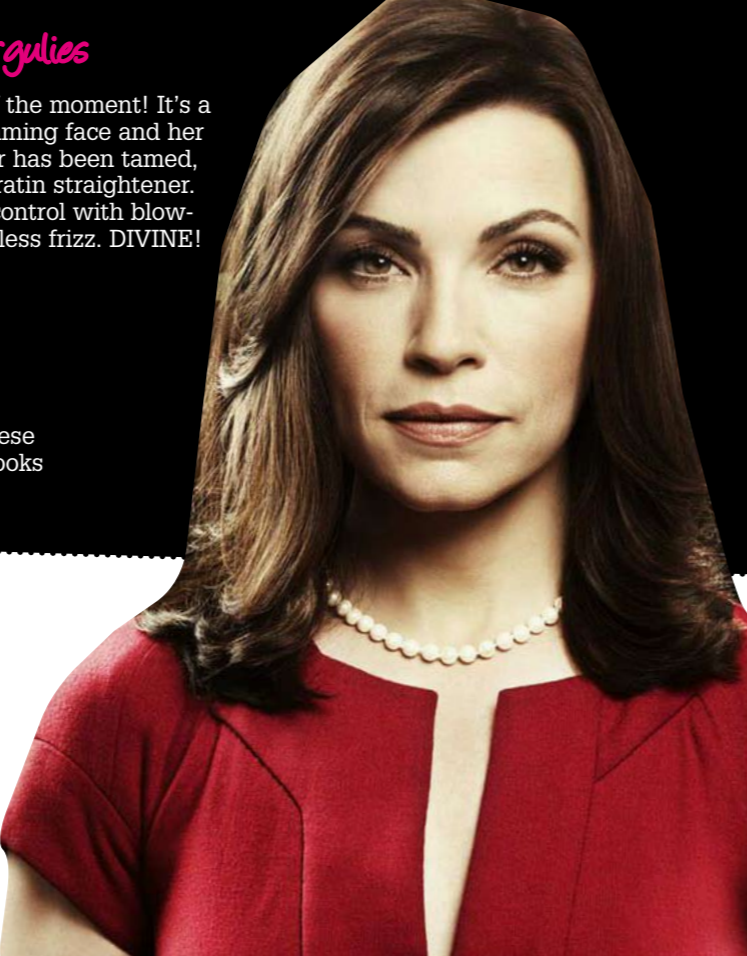

This look is messy, but structured. Once your hair is dried straight, use tongs to curl some sections. Part your fringe in the centre and smooth down. Back comb at the crown for extra vamp!

Blow-wave your hair straight with a large round brush giving plenty of root lift. Let the brush cool down on the ends to round them off. Next take a small triangular fringe section and plait to one side then secure it with a hairpin.
